Reading the Christmas Story

During my sophomore year at Whitworth College, I and other religion majors were invited to a religion department party. It was held off campus, at the home of one of the professors. We drank hot chocolate, ate some Christmas goodies, sang some Christmas carols, and read the Christmas story. As students of God's word, it was great to hear once again the familiar words of how our Lord and Savior was born to Mary and Joseph, even when there was no room for them in the inn...

The reading of the Christmas story, from the Gospel of Luke, made such an impression on me that when Jeana and I were blessed with our boys, I started a tradition of reading the Christmas story for our family. I even purchased a big family bible for this very purpose. I wish I could say that we faithfully observed this tradition every year, but in truth, we probably missed more years than we kept the tradition.

Still, I believe there is something very powerful about reading the Christmas story in your home. While the nativity story is part of every Advent and Christmas season at our church, it may create a renewed sense of the incarnation to read the story where you reside every day. God came to us, in all of the messiness of life, including where we hang our hats at night.

And you don't need a big family bible to read the Christmas story. You can use any kind of printed bible, or even the story on your laptop, phone, or tablet. The medium doesn't matter. The message is what is important.

The message of the Christmas story is timeless, and timely. God loved us enough to send His very own son into this world, our world, in order to save us. The baby Jesus arrived as a vulnerable infant, born to a poor couple in an out-of-the-way town while they were away from their hometown. But he did arrive, and angels and shepherds proclaimed what His birth meant for all of us: salvation. The light of God's love piercing the darkness of sin. The hopes of generations of God's people were finally fulfilled!

The story is an amazing one, and I would encourage you to read it once again this year. The heart of the story is found in Luke 1: 5-2:20, although you are welcome to read all of chapters 1 and 2, if you so choose. Don't forget the parts of the story found in the Gospel of Matthew, especially Matthew 1: 18-2:12, for this account relays the story from Joseph's perspective, and includes the visit of the Magi, or Wise Men.

My hope and prayer this Christmas season is that we would all read once again, the glorious and inspiring Christmas story.

'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' Matthew 1: 20-21
